

1. City Tour—full day

8 hours

This tour begins at Citadell Hill that is 350 metres high and a good point for views of the city. Then you travel to the Royal Castle on the Buda side for interior visits of St. Matthias Church, the Fishermen's Bastion and the Palace. There are visits to Heroes' Square, the Millennium Monument and Vajdahunyad Castle. After lunch (not incl. in the price) there is a visit to St. Stephen's Basilica followed by a walk on Margaret Island.



2. City Tour—half day

4 hours

This tour begins at Citadell Hill that is 350 metres high and a good vantage point for views of the city. Then you will see from outside St. Matthias Church and the Fishermen's Bastion. Later there are visits to Heroes' Square, the Millennium Monument and Vajdahunyad Castle. On the return journey to the city centre the coach passes St. Stephen's Basilica.



3. Budapest by Night

2 hours

This tour begins with a stop at the Citadell Hill that is 350 metres high and provides excellent views of the city, the Parliament Building and the Chain Bridge. Next there is a visit to Heroes' Square, the Millennium Monument and Vajdahunyad Castle. On the return journey to the city centre the coach passes St. Stephen's Basilica.



4. Danube Bend

7-8 hours

The first stop is the picturesque village of Szentendre. You will visit the Marzipan Museum. Next stop is Visegrád followed by a visit to the Cloud Castle which is on a hill and from the windows there is a fantastic panorama of the Danube Valley. After lunch (not incl. in the price) the group travels to Esztergom which is the seat of the Roman Catholic Primate of Hungary. You will see its Cathedral Treasury which holds the richest collection of Hungarian ecclesiastical treasures.



5. Puszta

7-8 hours

An unforgettable day in the Puszta starts with visit the main sights of Kecskemét followed by a visit to Lajosmizse. Guests are offered hot crackling scones and brandy under the walnut tree. There is a horseshow given by highly skilled horsemen. Later there's a possibility of a horse/carriage ride. Lunch is served in a local „csárda” (traditional inn) with gipsy music.



6. Eger

8 hours

Eger is one of the most beautiful towns in Hungary. With a historical past and heritage of monuments and buildings, Eger is also known as the Town of Patriotism. You will see its Castle from the Turkish era. The late Baroque Lyceum –today a teacher training college– has one of the most delightful libraries in Hungary. There is a group and wine tasting at Kulacs Csárda (traditional inn).



7. Smal Tour of Balaton

10-11 hours

The first stop is at Herend Ceramic factory. It is a museum for the porcelain industry and there is also a working, operating mini factory to see. The tour continues to Balatonfüred with a walk around the town and the Balaton Corso. The next stop is at Tihany with its famous Abbey that was founded in 1055. A meal is served at a Hungarian 'csárda' (traditional inn) with good food and lovely ambience.



8. Grand Tour of Balaton

11-12 hours

This excursion takes you to the lake Balaton, often called the 'Hungarian Sea'. Firstly, you will stop at Balatonfüred for walking around the town and the Balaton Corso. Next there is a visit to the lovely village of Tihany and the famous Abbey. Lunch is served (incl. in the price) at Badacsony, the wine district. After lunch you will go to the settlement of Keszthely to explore the Festetics Castle and, on the way back, you will stop for dinner with entertainment (not incl. in the price).



9. Sissi Palace Godollo

5 hours

This is an excursion to Gödöllő to visit Sissi Palace. It is one of the largest Baroque Palaces in Hungary and is unparalleled for its colourful, historical past and renowned for its style-setting architecture. In 1996 it was restored and has 26 completely renovated rooms, providing a home for an unique introduction to the interior of royal suites in Hungary with a beautiful garden. Lunch can be ordered on request.



BUDAPEST TOURS

10. Boat Trip on Danube

1 hour

This 1 hour long trip offers an interesting sightseeing tour from a different angle. Whilst cruising along the Danube you will see many of Budapest's most famous sights



11. Boat Trip with Dinner or Lunch

2 hours

This 2 hours long trip begins with a welcome drink followed by a hot and cold buffet. Whilst cruising along the Danube you will see many of Budapest's most famous sights.



12. Thermal Bath Program

2 hours

This tour takes you to the Széchenyi Bath, the largest thermal baths in Budapest. It is a vast complex of indoor and outdoor pools, the premier medicinal bath of Pest. The neo-Baroque bath were built in 1913, the swimming pool in 1927. First there is walk through the building followed by a relax session floating in a thermal pool and the swimming pool. Later you can try the steam bath and sauna. A 15 minutes soaped massage is included.



13. Szentendre—Visegrad

6 hours

Szentendre was originally settled by Serb refugees and still retains a South Slav air, not only in the Orthodox churches and Cyrillic inscribed monuments but also in its Mediterranean townscape. Artists rediscovered this village in the 1920s and turned it into an art colony. Later the tour visits the Marzipan Museum. The next stop is Visegrád, a village that was the capital of Hungary in the XIVth century. There is a visit to the 'Cloud Castle', located cca 300 metres above the village.



14. Painting Tour

6 hours

The first stop is the Hungarian National Museum that has over a million art objects focusing on Hungarian history. Next you will be taken to Heroes' Square and will visit the Museum of Fine Arts with its huge collection of Egyptian, Greek and Roman pieces, together with paintings by European masters. The final part of the tour takes place at Vajdahunyad Castle that houses the largest agricultural museum in Europe.



15. Parliament Tour

45 minutes

Built at the end of the 19th / beginning of the 20th century, Budapest's Parliament Building is one of the largest national assemblies in the world. It is a beautiful building with countless spires and 'lace' ornamentation. After ascending the magnificent staircase you will be shown the two symmetrical wings that used to be the Upper and Lower House of the pre-communist parliament. The rich interior and gorgeous decoration of the building are well worth seeing as part of a guided tour.
